Age category (demographic cohort) – also called generations	Definition
Generation Z (also known as The Founders, Post-Millennials, the iGeneration)	Those born in the 1980s and 1990s who reached adulthood in the first decade of the 2000s.
Millennials (also known as Generation Y)	The cohort consists of those born between the 1920s and the 1940s. They are called silent generation because they concentrated on their careers rather than issues such as civil and women's rights.
Generation X (MTV generation)	Those born from the mid-1990s onwards who have grown up in the age of the internet.
Baby Boomers	One of the smallest cohorts. The generation that grew up from the mid-1960s onwards. They grew up in an age when women fully entered the workforce.
Silent Generation	People born between 1943 and 1960 when many soldiers returned from active service and caused a 'baby boom' in their home nations.
