

Examples of everyday contracts:

- Buying lunch in a canteen
- Pay and display car parks
- Booking a holiday
- Mobile phone contract
- Buying groceries in a supermarket.

Laissez-Faire

- People have the freedom to enter into a contract on their own terms.
- Courts do not make judgments on the fairness of contracts – if it was agreed, they should be enforced.

Limitations to contract law:

- Unfair Contract Terms Act 1977
- Consumer Rights Act 2015
- Consumer Contracts (Information, Cancellation and Additional Charges) Regulations 2013.

Aim of contract law:

to provide a legal framework for contracting parties to resolve contractual disputes.

Human Rights Act 1998:

- s3 Human Rights Act 1998 provides that all domestic law must be interpreted in a way which is compatible with the European Convention on Human Rights.
- **Key Case:** Shansal v Al-Kishtaini (2001)
